


High School Graduation Requirements

24 credits 2.0 Unweighted GPA 1 Online course 1 Fine Art course Take/Pass required assessments Community Service Project: 25 Hours

Assessments:

Pass 10th grade FSA ELA

Pass one math EOC (Algebra or Geometry)
OR

Meet concordant score on SAT/ACT

What courses do you need to graduate?

Core classes:

English all 4 years = 4 credits

Math all 4 years = 4 credits

Science 3 years = 3 credits

Social Studies 3 years = 3 credits

Required Electives:

PE: 1/2 PE 1/2 Personal Fitness (or 1.0 credit of HOPE)

Fine or Performing Art (1 year = 1 credit)

*Foreign Language: A minimum of 2 years of the same language is required for Bright Futures

Scholarship and FL SUS college admissions

*Other electives: You will take at least 8 electives throughout your 4 years of high school

- 3. Reminder that students may use this as a concordant score for the Algebra I EOC and 10th Grade ELA exams.



- Minimum of 25 total hours before graduation
- Non-profit organization

More about the SAT/ACT

- Plan to take the SAT and/or ACT in February/March of Junior year
- Compare your scores
- Prep for/register to retake test
 - ACT test prep or Khan Academy (SAT)
- Retake the SAT or ACT 2-3 times
- Fee waivers for those eligible for Free and Reduced Lunch
- Most college super score
 - Take the highest reading and highest math

- GPA
- Academic Rigor
- Test scores (SAT/ACT)
- Extracurricular Activities
 - o clubs, community service, athletics
- Leadership positions
- Teacher/Counselor recommendations (if required)

Ordering Transcripts:
